Recently, we welcomed students from the University of Pennsylvania School of Veterinary Medicine who spent the day learning about Hillside's practices of sustainable agriculture and animal welfare. The 2nd year vet students are studying the Human Animal Bond led by Dr. Carlo Siracusa. There is a critical connection among animal welfare, human health, and the environment. Chet Mozloom, Joe O'Brien, Sierra Krohnemann, and Suzanne Kapral shared farm-based lessons on our dairy operations, pastured hens, heifers, swine, and non-dairy animals with an emphasis on Dr. Ayers' message, "we all live downstream." Penn Vet student, Amanda Santos, stated, "It was wonderful to learn about how Hillside maintains animal welfare to the highest standard. There is a real bond between the workers and the animals, and quite frankly some of the nicest cows we've ever met."
